Whitehead, accountant for the Diamond Rubber Co., who was at the wheel of an automobile which the police say ran down and killed 12 year old Jeanette Hollibaugh here last Friday night, surrendered today to Chief of Police Seymour and was booked at the city prison on a charge of manslaughter. Whitehead refused to make a statement, but said later that his attorney would issue a written one.

REBELS STILL TAKING TOWNS

(By United Press Leased Wire.) EL PASO, Tex., May 22.—The first day of peace between the Mexican federalists and insurgents here was disquieting and filled with portents that further trouble is by no means unlikely. Many telegrams were received at Madero's headquarters today expressing the complaints of rebel leaders at the proposed peace and it is probable that Chihuahua will be occupied in order to satisfy the firebrands.
In the interior the insurgents are still active and hourly reports are coming in that the smaller towns, in widely separated regions, are falling into rebel hands.

More Evidence Brought By Burns Men

The exhibits consist of five sealed packages which contain numerous articles used in making infernal machines.
Certain books, letters and papers found in the office of J. J. McNamara, after he was arrested, as well as the suit cases which J. B. McNamara and Ortle McManigal were carrying when arrested in Detroit by Burns detectives, were brought here by the operatives.


