

Dark Family Skeleton Rattles In a Standard Oil Closet

DEPRAVITY OF PIERCE'S SON, TOLD IN COURT BY FATHER AND BROTHER WITHOUT EMOTION. NEW YORK, May 30.—The sight of a Standard Oil millionaire testifying that his son is a morphine fiend, takes 40 drinks and smokes 60 cigars a day and has never worked in his life was offered to Jaded New York by Henry Clay Pierce. The testimony in Justice Morschauer's court was a good deal warmer than the weather. Most of it was whispered, but the spectators heard enough to form a very definite conclusion about the son, Roy E. Pierce. Roy Pierce married Betsy Faulkner Chapman, an actress, last November, and suit was brought to annul the marriage. The millionaire father told the story without a trace of emotion. He described two interviews with his son, in which the young man asked for \$25,000 a year for his bride. The son told his father that she was getting that amount from an admirer, and wouldn't live with him unless she got a like amount from the Pierce exchequer. She also threatened to go into vaudeville as Mrs. Roy E. Pierce if the "old man didn't come across."

Millionaire Pierce refused and a few hours after each interview he found his son unconscious from morphine. "At the time of his marriage," said Millionaire Pierce, "my son indulged in from 25 to 40 drinks and from 40 to 60 cigars daily. His mind was clouded and he was not responsible for his acts."

"Absolutely," replied the millionaire father. Thereon Pierce, brother of Roy, helped to rattle the Pierce family skeleton and joined his father in blasting the reputations of the brother and his wife. He described the trip to Paris with Roy, when they met Mrs. Chapman. "Roy went the rounds in Paris," said Theron. "He was in the company of women five days out of the week."

Time and again he alluded to his brother's wife in words that cannot be printed. Of his brother he spoke in the same way, revealing more sordid details as he recounted the recent years in the life of the young man. Last October Theron said his brother was an habitual drunkard, that he never came home before 4 a. m., and his condition was horrible. When father and son had finished testifying they had left nothing to the imagination in telling one of the blackest stories of mal and physical depravity ever revealed. Young Pierce is now in a sanitarium. An attempt not decided to accept.

\$12,000 OFFER FOR PASTOR NEW YORK, May 30.—American ministers refuse to take a back seat in competition with the clergymen from England. Rev. William Pierson Merrill of Chicago has been offered \$12,000 a year and a house to become pastor of the Brick Presbyterian church of New York. Drs.
