 LONDON, June 30.—Determined to fight to the last ditch against recognition of the seamen's union and the demands of their striking sailors the Shipping Federation today decided to lay up half their total tonnage and to apportion the men still loyal to them to the other half. In answer the strikers immediately ordered that every port be tied up at all costs and

White Star Fires Men

LIVERPOOL, June 29.—The White Star line here today discharged all its employees excepting its officers and engineers and hereafter will employ only non-union men. All shipping except on trans-Atlantic lines is paralyzed and docks are lined with rioting footstuffs and on every pier are guards of police. Grave fear is felt lest the strikers, growing desperate, resort to arson.

DUBLIN, June 30.—Through the seamen's strike all shipping here is at a standstill and the police are on guard at every dock. Scores have been arrested.
