**Try to Take Teeth Out Of Pettit Ordinance**

**STILES ORDINANCE SUITS LIQUOR MEN, BUT DOESN'T SUIT PETTIT—SAFETY COMMISSIONER WILL DEMAND CHANGES.**

The "business men" who were rampant against "freak legislation" two weeks ago, are now clamoring for the passage of the saloon ordinance. They think they have it now so that the liquor selling safes and dives will be no more.

They are bombarding Seymour and other commissioners asking that the ordinance be passed tomorrow before Freeland gets back.

Pettit says he will demand some changes from the thing Judge Stiles has written. Stiles wrote it the way the liquor selling cafes wanted it. It does not suit Pettit.

When it is finished it will probably provide that restaurants that sell liquor may do so when connected with a saloon if they take out an additional service bar license for \$300.

All boxes and greens must be taken out.

If the Annex for instance wanted to continue it would have to put up a partition between it and the Olympic club saloon, take out all the boxes and put in a little service bar.

These provisions Pettit will insist on going into the ordinance.

**PRISONER DIED OF PNEUMONIA**

Oscar Thompson, who died in a cell at the city jail yesterday morning, and who had been booked as having a case of delirium tremens, was found by Coroner Shaver to have been suffering from pneumonia. There will be no inquest as the coroner says he can not place the blame upon anyone.

Thompson was an habitual drunkard and had likely contracted the disease while on a drunk. He was 29 years old and has a sister in Long Beach, Cal., who was notified of his death.

**Chicken Pot Pie**  
The Chef's Favorite  
By Mrs. Janet McKenzie Hill, Editor of the Boston Cooking School Magazine.

Some folks think that only "colored mammals" can cook chicken, but a trial of this famous chicken pot pie disproves that assertion. Every member of the family will thoroughly enjoy it.



**K C Chicken Pot Pie, Baked Dumplings.**

One fowl cut in joints; 1-4 cup flour; 1-2 teaspoonful salt; black pepper; 2 cups flour; 3 level teaspoonfuls K C Baking Powder; 1-2 teaspoonful salt; 1-4 cup shortening milk or cream.

Cover the fowl with boiling water and let simmer until tender, then remove to a baking dish. Mix the 1-4 cup flour, salt and black pepper with cold water to a smooth paste and use to thicken the broth. Remove the fat from the top of the broth if necessary before adding the thickening. Pour this gravy over the fowl, until it is nearly covered, and reserve the rest to serve apart. Sift together the flour, baking powder and salt, three times; into this work the shortening and use cream or milk to make a dough, less stiff than biscuits. Put this by spoonfuls over the fowl in the dish, which it should rest upon and completely cover. Let bake about 35 minutes.

When young, tender chickens are scarce, this presents a most satisfactory way of serving old fowls. Veal or lamb prepared in this manner is more appetizing than when served as a stew.
