CAN'T BE A LAWYER 'CAUSE SHE'S A WOMAN! THAT'S GEORGIA LAW

BUT MRS. HALE WON'T TAKE "NO" AND APPEALS TO THE LEGISLATURE TO REVISE OBSOLETE CODE.

ATLANTA, Ga., Aug. 3.—Mrs. Minnie Anderson Hale wants to be a lawyer—and she's going to be if it takes a special act of the legislature to make her one. There's no other way in Georgia. No matter how much a woman knows, she can't be a lawyer in Georgia under the present law, because she's a WOMAN!

Mrs. Hale's husband died a few years ago, leaving her a small competence and a baby. She was up against the bread and butter question and an education for her child. So she studied law.

Mrs. Hale was a bright student. She took the course at the Atlanta law school and was graduated with honors. Then she appeared before the supreme court for admittance to the bar.

The laws of Georgia provide that every graduate of the Atlanta law school shall be admitted to practice, but an eagle-eyed judge discovered that they also provide that only "males" can practice. Consequently, Mrs. Hale was turned down.

Mrs. Hale is young, smart and energetic, so she betook herself to the statehouse. She has written a bill amending the code to permit women to practice law in Georgia, and it looks as if the legislature would pass it.

"I am the victim of obsolete law brought over from England," says I

Mrs. Hale, "but now discarded by the country whence it came. Georgia cannot hold up its head as a progressive community if my bill is defeated. A woman should have the right to earn her living in any profession for which she is fitted. There isn't a shadow of doubt that I will eventually enjoy that right."

GETTING OFF CAR BACKWARDS ONLY PERFECTLY NATURAL WAY FOR WOMEN

Why does a woman get off a street car backwards? This is one of the questions that has bothered men ever since street cars were invented, and women commenced to demonstrate their predisposition to climb off "backwards," with resultant smashups, indignation, hurt pride, lawsuits and the like.

Here's the reason, discovered and admitted by a woman. The real reason is a physical one. Getting off backwards is the only perfectly natural way for a woman to get off, whatever disastrous results may be.

Did you ever watch a mother carrying her baby? If you never did, you may perhaps have watched the average woman trot along with her arms full of bundles, or, if you are a woman, you have undoubtedly yourself either carried packages or a baby—maybe both.

And if you are one of the ninety-nine women out of a hundred, you carry that baby in your left arm, the packages in your left hand, your purse in your left hand—not altogether, of course; but as far as possible; for, while a woman cannot be classed as a "left-handed race" they carry their burdens in the left hand and arm, leaving the right free to pick up their skirts or to defend themselves with mayhap; whatever the reason, the right arm is left free. That perhaps it is instinctively left free as a weapon of defense.

Therefore, passing up the preamble and returning to the subject in hand, namely, "Why does a woman get off a street car backwards?" she does this because when she leaves the car, from instinct, whether her left hand is really occupied with packages or not, it is supposed to be, and her trusty right is her business hand, she therefore takes hold of the hand support with her right hand instead of her left, which would face her correctly for alighting from the car in the safe and proper way, and she simply lets go and drops off backwards.

No legislation, argument of doctors and health savers will ever work a reform on women as to their method of leaving street cars; whenever a revolution is worked along that line, it will be when women study the matter from a physical point of view, and train themselves along new and different lines.

All Around the Home

Never use a metal spoon in stirring fruit and vegetables when canning. A wooden one is best, and those with short handles are preferable.

During the summer keep on hand a syrup made by boiling 1 cup sugar to 1 pint of water. When cool put in fruit jar. Mix with lemon juice for lemonade. It is a good thing to keep it in stock for various summer drinks.

Mutton dripping will not set hard and suety if directly the fat is poured from the baking tin, the vessel containing it is put at the back of the stove and allowed to stay there until the stove itself cools.

To remove the smell of fresh paint put a pall of cold water in the room and change it every two or three hours.

Dish covers may be easily kept bright and clean. Remove grease with warm water and soda, dry with a soft cloth, then apply a little metal polish with a flannel. A final polish with fine whiting will then make the covers look like silver.

Nickel silver should be cleaned with ammonia and whiting. Take half a cupful of finely powdered whiting and work it into a paste with a cupful of cold water in which a tablespoonful of rock ammonia has been dissolved. Keep this in a well corked bottle and use it for scouring. Afterward polish with a leather.

Before broiling a slice of ham rub brown sugar on it. The ham

will have a delicious flavor.

Hot soda water is an excellent cleanser for hair brushes. Rub the bristles well without bending them too much or breaking them and dry the brush in the sun. The bristles will be white and stiff as new after such treatment.

Ivory knife handles which have become yellow may be improved in appearance by being rubbed with cloth dipped in turpentine.

Salt and powdered borax added to the water in which they are will help to make cut flowers last much longer. The stems should be clipped each day and cut slanting to allow the water to rise in the stalks.
