Think Kruttschnitt Will Recognize Men

(United Press Leased Wire.) CHICAGO, Sept. 2.—Secretary Kramer of the Blacksmiths' union declared here today that no action would be taken on a possible strike on the Harriman lines until after Labor day.

(By United Press Leased Wire.) LOS ANGELES, Sept. 2.—Following the receipt of a telegram from San Francisco today, the contents of which are being kept secret, local labor leaders today appear to be confident that General Manager Kruttschnitt of the Harriman lines will soon recognize the system federation as a body and that all difficulties will be amicably adjusted.

Upon the arrival of the message, which is believed to be from President Kline of the Blacksmiths' union, a closed meeting was held by local leaders and they emerged smiling and apparently confident of ultimate victory.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 2.—A call to all committeemen of the Federation of Shop Employees on

the Harriman system to meet here next Tuesday was wired today by President J. W. Kline of the Blacksmiths' International union, acting as chairman of the conference of general officers, who were denied recognition as a federation by Vice President and General Manager Julius Kruttschnitt.

The result of the conference will likely determine whether or not steps will be taken to call a strike, and also deal with the possibility of another meeting with Kruttschnitt. That there is still some negotiation pending between the railroad chief and the union leader is believed through the transmission of a secret message at midnight from Kruttschnitt to Kline.

Kline stated today that any action on the part of the federation resulting from the refusal of Kruttschnitt to recognize the federation could be taken only after a thorough discussion on the part of all of the men chosen to represent the crafts involved. This means that 31 additional delegates will come to San Francisco from as distant points as New Orleans, Omaha, Denver, Portland, Peacoteo and San Diego to meet with the general officers and advisory board.

HOLD UP

(By United Press Leased Wire.)

REDDING, Cal., Sept. 2.—With a six hour handicap, five men who robbed the Southern Pacific express train No. 15

miles north of here, are far in the lead of the officers today who are searching the wild country which has been the scene of the three daring robberies this summer. That the bandits carry a big sack of coin is admitted by the Wells-Fargo Express company but the exact amount is withheld.

While the train was on a siding at Gibson, four miles above Lamoine, three of the bandits climbed in through the open door of the express car, covering Messner Meyers and his helper with

guns. Two men remained outside to keep the coast clear until the train started southward. Englebert Coleman and Conductor Dekeyer stuck their heads out and were fired at, the shots missing their mark.

As the train traveled at a good speed, the men blew open the two express safes with dynamite, which they handled with accuracy. The explosion buried wreckage to all parts of the car but nobody was injured. The big sack of coin was the only loot taken.

Meyers was made to pull the signal cord, stopping the train and letting the robbers take to the timber. They were later reported to be seen in an automobile.

55,000 FRISCO LABOR MEN FOR COAL PLAN

(By United Press Leased Wire.)

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 2.—The San Francisco Labor Council, representing 55,000 workers in all lines of industry here, today has given unanimous endorsement to the proposed government development of Alaskan coal lands.

In a resolution adopted unanimously, the council urges President Taft and congress to establish a commission to handle the project.

It is urged that the government itself, through the commission mine the people's coal, build its own railroads to transport the coal to tidewater and carry the product in government colliers to Pacific ports, there to be sold to the people at cost.

Copies of the resolution will be forwarded to President Taft, Secretary Fisher and California's representatives in congress.

M'NAMARA MONEY STOLEN

(By United Press Leased Wire.) MEDFORD, Ore., Sept. 2.—There is \$30,000 of the McNamara defense which will never be used for that purpose, unless the authorities succeed in apprehending A. H. Grey, secretary of the local cooks' and waiters' union, who disappeared Monday and has not been seen since.

Confesses He Threw Girl Into Lake

HOLLAND, Mich., Sept. 2.—Walter Hopper, sentenced to life imprisonment for pushing his sweetheart, Grace Lyon, off the steamer and drowning her in Lake Michigan confessed yesterday asking that he be hung or allowed to drop into the lake beside the girl he loved.

RAIN SAVES TREES

(By United Press Leased Wire.) PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 2.—Copius rains in the Cascades in western and southwestern Oregon today have done much toward putting an end to the danger of further loss of the forest fires. It is believed the rain will end the threatened danger of big timber conflagrations this fall.

7 DROWN Kidnaped Boy Found

(By United Press Leased Wire.) PORTLAND, Sept. 2.—The body of J. Lloyd Magness, who disappeared a few days before his marriage was to have taken place, was found today in the Willamette river near where his empty boat was found. He is thought to have committed suicide.

No trace has been found of Charles W. Jones, who disappeared while on a fishing trip.

PROTEST AT GOOD POINT CEMETERY MADE BY BEATTE SITE

JUDGE SNELL'S PLAN TO PUT BURYING GROUND IN WEST END DENOUNCED BY CITIZENS—COUNCIL MAY RE-SCIND ACTION.

The attempt of Judge W. H. Snell to put a cemetery on Sixth avenue in the coming residence section has stirred up a big row. Snell has a lot of ground not ready for the market yet. Wednesday he had the council vote through an ordinance turning it into a cemetery.

All voted for it but Pettit who was out of the room at the time. He did not sign the ordinance. Now the council may reconsider it.

Cemeteries Not Taxed. People in the west end say it is simply a scheme to avoid taxes on the real estate until other people buy around there and make the place valuable then Snell will plat and sell.

Under the law cemeteries are not taxed. Anyhow citizens do not want a grave yard stuck on the boulevard to the Narrows right up against the new site for the Annie Wright hospital.

J. B. Hawthorne was at the city hall today protesting. A. R. Titlow, who is spending \$200,000 to improve the West End, is furious. The whole West End is vowing vengeance on the commissioners if they do not rescind their action.

Edwin F. Masterson sent a letter this morning demanding a chance to protest.

GOOD POINT CEMETERY MADE BY BEATTE SITE

(By United Press Leased Wire.)

CHESTERFIELD COURT-HOUSE, Va., Sept. 2.—Charles H. Kastelburg, a rich meat dealer of Richmond, today gave strong support to Henry Beattie's story of the murder of his wife, for which the young banker is on trial here, Kastelburg on the stand admitted driving his automobile along the Middlethian turnpike on the night of the murder. He stopped at the scene of crime or nearby and refilled his radiator, while a Richmond woman accompanying him stood on the running board. The fact that his car stopped there is expected by the defense to refute testimony that Beattie's automobile had stopped at the scene of the crime before the killing.

Meanwhile the defense, apparently trying every means possible to prevent being forced to place Beattie on the stand, succeeded in effecting a delay of several hours today. Representatives of both prosecution and defense drove fifteen miles to secure the deposition of Mrs. M. C. Steger, who professes she saw a bearded man answering Beattie's description of the alleged murderer near the scene of the murder the night it occurred.
