Coal Is Saved

POINDEXTER GIVES OUT STRIKING INTERVIEW IN ALASKA—IS CONSIDERING GOVERNMENT OWNERSHIP CAREFULLY.

(By United Press Leased Wire.) SEWARD, Alaska, Sept. 9.—Gifford Pinchot, Senator Miles Poindexter and party reached Seward today en route to join Dr. Holmes and other government experts.

Time Is Ripe.
"The time has come for the Alaska question to be settled. The coal has been saved for the people. Now it must be utilized without further delay."

"I reserve my own judgment until I have personally seen the two most available coal fields and have studied the transportation question."

"I have been struck by the amount of sentiment in Cordova in favor of government railroad and of government ownership and operation of the coal mines. I shall give this plan careful attention."

Senator Poindexter emphatically favors a government railroad and line of steamships and at least one government coal mine as a check on any possible private monopoly.

Arrest Mayor of Model City for Taking Bribe

(By United Press Leased Wire.) GARY, Ind., Sept. 9.—With the mayor and one councilman already under arrest on charges of having accepted bribes in connection with a heating franchise, and with five other councilmen and the city engineer liable to be arrested, the municipal government of Gary, the "model city," today is practically disrupted.

Mayor Thomas E. Knotts is accused of soliciting \$5,000 for signing the "Dean heating franchise." Deputies made the arrest in the mayor's office immediately after T. B. Dean, reputed head of the syndicate seeking the franchise, came out with the franchise. Councilman Walter Gibson was arrested also for soliciting \$5,000.

Lyman is said to have a long record.

Lyman disappeared from Los Angeles about ten days ago. Several reputable men of Los Angeles occupied official positions in the company, and it is claimed they, as well as investors, were deceived by Lyman.

Lyman is alleged to have secured some \$50,000 in return for stock of practically no value. He lived in expensive style.

Lyman has operated in all parts of the world. Some time ago he was arrested on a fraud charge in Goldfield. He is said to have realized hundreds of thousands of dollars in deals, but each time managed to escape serious trouble.

Cut Wide Swath.
LOS ANGELES, Sept. 9.—Dr. Lyman, with his beautiful wife, cut quite a swath in the most exclusive circles of Los Angeles and Pasadena society. He was known as a good spender and maintained a handsome suite of apartments at the fashionable Hotel Green at Pasadena.

It is figured by postal inspectors that Lyman cleaned up about \$20,000 here.
