Italian-Turkey War Looks Certain

LONDON, Sept. 26.—Open defiance of the war threats of Italy by Turkey, mobilization of the Italian fleet and the alleged preparation of an ultimatum by Italy demanding the immediate cession of Tripoli by the Ottoman empire are the startling developments in the negotiations for the disputed trade center today. The situation is regarded here as very grave.

State Levy Is Lowered

(By United Press Leased Wire.)
OLYMPIA, Sept. 26.—The state board of equalization cut the state tax levy from 5.43 mills to 5.30 for the coming year, but the lesser levy will raise \$5,062,177 as against \$4,920,926 last year, due to higher valuations.

The board levied one mill for state highways, despite the fact the legislature made no provision for spending it. This will give \$955,126. The total valuation of all property in the state is \$2,007,277,760, without the railways.

General Election Only Hope For Home Rule

LONDON, Sept. 26.—Following internal dissension in his cabinet Premier Asquith will call a general election on the home rule bill. The bill will be introduced next April, then parliament will be dissolved and a fight waged on the Irish question.

John Redmond is now organizing a gigantic home rule campaign to educate the public to the real meaning of home rule.
