Gwendolyn, 12-months-old child of Earl McCoy of Centralia, died of blood poisoning from a pin scratch.

George Sherwood has bought the Coie farm near White Salmon, and will establish a world beating horse and cattle farm.

The H. M. Gilbert company of Toppish, is preparing to plant 240 acres of Yakima Indian reservation to fruit trees.

Chief Wahluclu of the Snoqualmie tribe of Indians, known as Jacob Kitsap, died at his home on Fort Madison reservation yesterday. He is supposed to have been considerably over 100 years old. He was a middle-aged man when Seattle was established 60 years ago, and in 1854 signed the peace treaty with the whites at Mukilteo.
