

# Assassination of Taft Was Feared

(By United Press Leased Wire.) DENVER, Oct. 4.—Police Chief Armstrong here today would not deny that, following a rumored plot to assassinate President Taft, he had doubled the guard about the chief executive until he left the city. Armstrong said the report was vague and he did not believe there was anything in it. "Still," he added, "I was taking no chances."

Just before President Taft left the banquet hall here last night it was reported that two men were overheard plotting to kill him while he was en route to his special train. Armstrong at once sent a special guard of 20 mounted police and a dozen city detectives who stayed right by the president's side until he was safe

in his car. During his entire stay here President Taft was never out of sight of a score of city sleuths.

## BANDITS LOOT MAIL CAR

(By United Press Leased Wire.) OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Oct. 4.—Three masked bandits looted the mail and baggage cars of a Missouri, Kansas & Texas train near Bartlesville today. Only a small amount of booty was secured.

# COWBOYS GREET TAFT IN WYO.

CHEYENNE, Wyo., Oct. 4.—Instead of the customary brass bands that generally meet President Taft at the places where he stops in his tour about the country, Cheyenne's citizens greeted him today with wild cowboy yells, emanating from a thousand throats. The president arrived here at 3:30 a. m., remaining in his car until 8:30, when he went to Fort Russell to inspect the army post.

Following the inspection, a wild west performance was given at Frontier park, where all of the old wild west properties were brought out for his benefit. The program was made up of roping, branding and broncho busting contests.

## Shasta Limited Held Up By Wreck

PORTLAND, Oct. 4.—The Shasta Limited and Southern Pacific passenger train No. 15, both southbound, are held up near Glendale, Ore., on account of the derailment of six freight cars of northbound Southern Pacific freight No. 222, from San Francisco. The freight was wrecked early today two miles north of Glendale and a number of horses in one of the cars were killed.

## Comet Mostly Made of Gas

## To Bring in More Strikebreakers

## Grandstand Collapses

(By United Press Leased Wire.) SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Oct. 4.—Fifteen were injured, five of whom may die, as a result of the collapsing of the bleachers at the racetrack and fair grounds here this afternoon. The injured were rushed to an emergency hospital at the fair grounds.

## Will Try to Carry Mail Across Continent in Airship

NEW YORK, Oct. 4.—Earl Ovington, the aviator, announced today his intention of starting from Governor's Island tomorrow morning on a transcontinental tour in a monoplane to Los Angeles. He will carry letters from Postmaster General Hitchcock and other officials and expects to make the trip in sixteen days.
