Ans.—4 cups scalded milk, 2-3 cups pearl tapioca, 3 eggs, 1-2 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon salt, and 1 tablespoon butter.
Toast the bread, slightly butter and sprinkle with sugar, beat eggs, two to a pint of milk, pour over the toast, and bake. Flavor to taste.

MRS. V'S RECIPES

Pig in Blankets.
Choose good sized, plump oysters. Wash, drain and wipe dry. Select some good bacon and cut very thin. Wrap a piece of this about an oyster and fasten each with a toothpick. Drop these into a hot frying pan, turning until crisp on all sides. Season with pepper and serve very hot.

Soft Molasses Cookies.
Try these if you want a soft molasses cookie. One cup molasses, 2 cup water, 1 cup shortening (boil water and shortening together), add 1 heaping teaspoon of soda, a little cinna-

mon, ginger, clove and salt. Mix so you can handle easily. Bake in quite a hot oven.

Cream Sponge Cake.
Two eggs, 1 cup of sugar, 1 cup of bread flour (with pastry flour the cake is apt to fall), 1-2 cup of thick, sweet cream, 1 teaspoon of cream of tartar, 1-2 teaspoon of soda; flavor with lemon. It is of no use to attempt this without the thick cream, for in that lies the gist of the rule.

French Salad Dressing.
One teaspoon mustard, one teaspoon salt, two teaspoons flour, two teaspoons powdered sugar, few grains cayenne, one teaspoon melted butter, yolk of one egg, one-third cup hot vinegar, one-half cup thick cream. Mix dry ingredients. Add butter, egg and vinegar slowly. Cook over boiling water, stirring constantly until the mixture thickens. Cool and then add cream or milk and the white of an egg beaten to a stiff froth. Be sure the yolk of the egg is well beaten before adding to rest, that it may not cook in lumps.

Pickled Cabbage and Cauliflower.
Here is a recipe for pickled cabbage and cauliflower. I think you will like it as it is very good. Take three heads of cauliflower, break them into small pieces and soak in salt and water over night. Take two small heads of red cabbage or one large one, cut up small and soak in salt and water over night. In the morning rinse them off with clear water. Take 2 quarts of vinegar, 2 ounces white mustard seed, 1 tablespoon of whole cloves, 3 sticks cinnamon broken up. Put the vinegar and spices on to boil. When it boils put cauliflower in and boil till tender. Skim out, put the cabbage in and boil till tender. Then put the sugar in to suit taste. I always put in 2 pounds of sugar, then put the cauliflower in and boil it 5 or 6 minutes. Then put in a stone pot and cover it tight and it will keep all winter if you don't eat it up.
