MRS. V.'S RECIPES

Dainty Vanilla Wafers.
One cup sugar, 2-3 cup butter, 4 tablespoons milk, 1 tablespoon vanilla, 1 egg, 1 1/2 teaspoons cream tartar, 2-3 teaspoon soda, flour to roll very thin. Cut in very small fancy shapes.

Chocolate Marble Cake.
One and one-half cups sugar, 1/2 cup butter, 1 1/2 cups milk, 3 cups flour, 1 egg, 3 heaping teaspoons baking powder. Divide in halves and mix 1 square of melted chocolate with one-half.

Sauces for Puddings.
Sauce for Plum Pudding—Cream together a cupful of sugar and half a cupful of butter. When light and creamy, add the well-beaten yolks of four eggs. Stir into this one wine-glass of wine or brandy, a pinch of salt and 1 large cupful of hot cream or rich milk. Beat this mixture well, place it in a saucepan over the fire, stir it until it cooks sufficiently to thicken like cream, be sure and not let it boil. Delicious.

Delicious Pudding Sauce.—To 4 large spoons of fine white sugar, add two of butter, one of flour and stir them together to a cream. Cut the white of an egg to a stiff froth and add. Then pour into the bowl a gill of boiling water stirring the mixture very fast. Put into the sauce tureen and add essence of lemon or rose, or grate nutmeg over the top, as desired.

Sour Cream Cookies.
One egg beaten light, 1 heaping cup sugar, 1 teaspoon soda in 1 cup sour cream. Flavor to suit. Pastry flour to roll. Moisten tops with little milk and beaten yolk of egg. These will melt in your mouth.

Sour Milk Pie.
One cup thick sour milk, 1 cup chopped raisins seeded, 1/2 cup sugar or more if needed, 1/2 cup butter size of a walnut, nutmeg and cinnamon and 1 egg. Make with two crusts.

A.—Gladly. Here it is: Mix 1 1/2 teaspoons soda with 1 cup sour milk, and add to 1 cup molasses. Sift together 2 1-3 cups flour, 2 teaspoons ginger, and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Combine mixtures, and beat in vigorously 1/4 cup melted butter. Bake in a buttered shallow pan, 25 minutes in a moderate oven.
