

\$3,000,000 Suit For Spreckles

(By United Press Leased Wire.) SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Feb. 3.—Suit against John D. and Adolph B. Spreckles for \$3,220,918 was filed today by the Southern Pacific Railroad company in the United States district court here.

The suit is based on charges by the railroad company that the Spreckles brothers broke a contract made in November, 1906, by which the Harriman system was to furnish funds to build the San Diego and Arizona railroad from San Diego to Yuma, Arizona. The Spreckles brothers originally launched the project to give better overland facilities to San Diego, which now is reached only by the Santa Fe.

Armed Squatters Defy Sheriff

(By United Press Leased Wire.) SOUTH BEND, Wash., Feb. 3.—Determined to hold possession of mining claims they staked out on the ranch of John Ellsworth, near here, 150 armed men and women are camped today along the South Fork river, despite the efforts of the sheriff to dislodge them.

Early in the week it was learned that a valuable vein of gold bearing quartz had been found on the Ellsworth ranch. There was an immediate rush for the locality from here and other towns.

SHE WON'T WEAR PANTS, SO THERE!

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 3.—A preparatory school, then a course in Vassar college, then life in Portland with her parents, is the program Miss Rose Eleanor Jewel, 16 years, and daughter of Jue Sue, Chinese aristocrat and one-time Chinese gambling king of the Pacific coast has mapped out for herself for the next five years. Miss Jewel, whose name in Chinese is Rosa Sue, created consternation among her relatives by running away from a school in Canton because she was forced to wear trousers.

In Shanghai she became engaged to a Chinese—Mandarin, but when she found that he had another wife she broke the engagement. Miss Jewel says this country is a better place for women than China; that she will never go back to China because she don't want to wear trousers; that she wouldn't marry a Chinese unless he had taken a course through the American universities; likes automobiles and theaters.

"China is coming forward every day," she said. "They have lots of schools there and the boys and girls can both go to the same school. The boys are allowed to cut their queues and the girls that go to school are called free girls. Moving picture shows are very popular there and are crowded most of the time." Miss Jewel was born in Los Angeles, came to Portland at 14 and finished grammar school and attended business college one year. She has a sister in Hong Kong, a teacher of English in a Chinese government school.


