Oil Stock Worth \$160,080,000

Rockefeller in the Standard Oil company through the contest for the control of the Waters-Pierce Oil company between the Rockefeller and Pierce interests. It developed during the contest that before the dissolution of the trust Rockefeller held 232,000 shares of the Standard Oil company of New Jersey. At the present value, \$690 a share, Rockefeller would receive \$160,080,000 for his stock.
