

# Taft's New Manager is There With Donation and Glad Hand

URBANA, Ill., Feb. 24.—The people of the combined towns of Urbana and Champaign, from which hails Congressman William B. McKinley, President Taft's new campaign manager, worship at his shrine and his party followers know no other god. It is he who endows churches, libraries and other public institutions and gives liberally to every local enterprise.

That he has purchased popularity by the bar in his home community and district is admitted by his closest friends.

A recent \$35,000 to the University of Illinois, Y. M. C. A. fund has strengthened him politically both in university and religious circles. He is several times a millionaire and, perhaps, can afford the donation policy.

The new Taft manager is "Billy" McKinley to nearly everybody in the district and when he boards one of the cars on his own electric line it's "Hello, Billie," or "Hello, Charlie," and the glad hand to motorman and conductor. He knows them all. This policy is not so costly as the other.

Congressman McKinley's rise in national politics has been meteoric. Everybody in his home town recalls the painful occasion of his nomination to congress in 1904. Up to that time he had never made a speech—had never appeared

much in public at all, and when called before the vast audience, his terror was pitiable. It was a had case of stage fright, pure and simple. He had his speech all written out, but was unable to read it so that those four rows back could hear that returned from his trip to the Philippines with the Taft party that his constituents learned he could speak in public.

There are some interesting facts about McKinley's political life which the people of his home town don't hear much about because the newspaper boys here don't like to offend "Billy." Here they are:

He managed the last congressional campaign in which the democrats overwhelmed the republicans and wiped out the republican control of the house of representatives.

He is a protege of "Uncle Joe" Cannon, who is affiliated with McKinley in the traction and other speculative business.

He managed the anti-Taft campaign four years ago, which was waged by the so-called "alies," Fairbanks, Cannon, Knox and Foraker, in their effort to secure southern delegates and to prevent the nomination of Taft. It is interesting to speculate if McKinley opposed Taft four years ago when the latter was supposed to be a progressive, why he is for him now.

McKinley was given important committee appointments by Speaker Cannon on account of the latter's friendship, being named chairman of the committee on coinage, weights and measures, and a member of the banking and several other financial committees.

He has voted always on the reactionary side of every legislative proposition.

He is best known as the giver of expensive junkets to congressmen and members of the press. It was he who took a party of 50 or more to view the site of the Jamestown exposition and later chartered a steamer and private cars and took Speaker Cannon and a group of his friends for a tour in the West Indies.

He is typical of money-hacked Standpatism in its most blind form.

Wurzbacher is named in indictments returned by a federal grand jury at Juneau, charging him with conspiring to destroy competition in the transportation business between Skagway and Southern ports to gain a monopoly for the Alaska Steamship company.


