Ride Down Men And Women In Textile Strike

TROOPERS AND POLICE ARE BRUTAL LABOR BUREAU STARTS TO PROBE

(By United Press Leased Wire.) LAWRENCE, Mass., Feb. 28.—Plans were completed today whereby 150 children of the striking textile workers are to go to Washington to plead with congress for an investigation of the strike. The delegation plans to leave for the capital tomorrow, and it is expected that the house committee on rules will give them a hearing Friday.

The Washington officials regard the case as identical with that of the night riders when eight men were fined. It does not matter, it was pointed out, whether the children's tickets had been purchased since they were actually on their way when stopped.

The maximum penalty for violation of the Sherman law is a \$1,000 fine and one year's imprisonment.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 28.—Investigation of the condition of the striking textile workers at Lawrence, Mass., was ordered today by the bureau of commerce and labor. Secretary Nagel and Dr. Charles P. Neill, United States labor commissioner, decided that the authorization of such an investigation was unnecessary.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 28.—Thoroughly angered by the blocking in the senate of his demand for a speedy inquiry into and action on the mill owners and police methods in crushing the Lawrence textile strikers, Senator Miles Poindexter of Washington today said to the United Press: (By Miles Poindexter, United States senator from Washington.)

Republican senators Lodge, Gallinger and Smoot are found fighting shoulder to shoulder with democratic Senators Bailey, Overman and Williams to obstruct and delay a simple request for facts? Are they afraid of the trusts? Is the constitution a dead letter when it comes to the bill of rights and the supposed guarantee of personal liberty? Are no human rights contemplated by the constitution when they compete with dollar rights?

I have asked for an inquiry. It has been blocked by every variety of pretext and other investigations have been interposed with the obvious intent to delay, to obstruct, to confuse and conceal the facts. Is it true that Massachusetts has substituted industrial for chattel slavery, and in smug hypocrisy, fears that the facts will be brought to the attention of the world?

KNOX AND FAMILY OFF FOR CRUISE; IT'S HONEYMOON FOR YOUNGSTERS





BARONS LOSE, CHARGE T. R. TRUST PROBE WITH FRAUD (United Press Leased Wire.) CHICAGO, Feb. 28.—A sweeping victory for the government in the case of J. Ogden Armour and nine other Chicago millionaires beef packers charged with violations of the Sherman anti-trust law came today when Judge Carpenter decided to admit as evidence all records of transactions and agreements made at the meetings of the directors of the National company. These records tend to sustain the charges of unlawful conspiracy against the beef barons.

GIRLS STEAL BATH IN BARBER SHOP (United Press Leased Wire.) TURKS LOSE FIGHT ROME, Feb. 28.—A heavy defeat was given the Turks and their Arab allies by the Italian forces, after an all-day battle near Mount Merghab, 70 miles east of Tripoli. The Turks and Arabs suffered heavy losses. The Italian loss was 11 killed and 82 wounded.

HANCOCK, Mich.—Mrs. Albert Rittenberg sent a "write up" of her forty-sixth birthday to a local paper. The editor thought it an "obit" and published it as a funeral notice.

Man Disappears And Foul Play Is Feared

He was later traced to a barber shop, where he was seen to board an automobile, ostensibly for this city. Since then he has not been seen. Foul play is feared.

Will Try Esther Allstrum For Magazine Article

Did Esther Allstrum misrepresent the city attorneys? Frank R. Baker says she did, and he declares he will prove it by the court records. BOLD ROBBER EXONERATE CHAUFFEUR

(By United Press Leased Wire.) SAN JOSE, Cal., Feb. 28.—Boldly entering the bank of J. A. Costa in North Market street here today, an unmasked robber held up Costa at the point of a revolver, took \$4,500 from an open safe and, rushing out of the building, leaped into a waiting automobile and with a companion escaped in the direction of San Francisco.

The bandit backed Costa into a back room, gagged him and bound him to a chair. Costa was not discovered until Henry Ballaris, who has a real estate office in the building, arrived to begin work and discovered the captive banker.
