No Lighthouse For John Early

Despite reports to the contrary, John Early, Tacoma's leper, whose disposition has kept the county in an uproar for a month, may yet go to Eagle Island, as proposed by the county commissioners—if he wants to.

Early will not be lighthouse-keeper there, however. Johnson, the present tender, has held the job for 25 years and given satisfaction.

U. S. Lighthouse Inspector Beck made an investigation yesterday at the request of Congressman Warburton. He made the following statement today:

Give Revokable License. "My report to the government will be substantially as follows: That the government issue a revokable license to the county commissioners to use part of Eagle Island as a residence for John Early and for his family, if the latter desire.

"Early to dwell at the north end of the island, and to cut very little if any timber, as the trees afford an echo for steamers in case of fog. The license to be renewed at the end of the five years, if desirable."

Eagle Island is a small island between McNelly and Anderson. It is fertile, but has few inhabitants.

Beck also investigated the proposition of a light on the middle Tacoma waterway. He will probably recommend a flashing beacon light.

GIVE 'EM WORK AND MAKE 'EM WORK

JUDGE HERBERT F. BRIGGS. PRESNO, Cal., March 6.—This is Herbert F. Briggs, who has held the job of police judge for six years in Fresno, Cal. Judge Briggs has come out with a declaration that the system of handling hoboes and petty offenders is wrong. For six years he has been sending men to jail or "floating them out of town."

The first method does very little good in the majority of cases, he says, and the second is only a make-shift, throwing responsibility on someone else. Briggs favors the employment of city and county prisoners on public highways or a farm.

To give the man willing to work a chance to work at a fair wage and to compel the man to work who says he won't work, both classes to contribute to the practical public benefit, is the Briggs idea.

Missing Worker Not Yet Found

Nothing has been heard from Albert Kleiner, who disappeared Monday morning while on his way to work. City Detectives Harkins and Ellison worked on the case all of yesterday afternoon but were unable to get a clue to his whereabouts except that he was going toward the tideflats when last seen.

Kleiner was a man of about 32 years of age, has a wife and three small children. He had been worried for some time about financial troubles. He was not a drinking man and no possible reason can be thought of to account for his disappearance.


