(By United Press Leased Wire.) NEW YORK, March 13.—The statement that a sleeping volcano, dormant for many centuries, is threatening the safety of the Panama canal is made in reports from Colon today.

The volcano underlies the Culebra cut. The fear of volcanic trouble had its origin in the fact that clouds of steam and blue smoke have been rising from newly turned earth. Every drill hole in the affected area is tested with a thermometer before dynamite is put in to prevent a premature explosion. The canal commission's geologist declares that the steam and smoke are due only to the oxidization.
