# Doctor Says He Exchanged Imbecile Son's Brains For Good Ones and Both Patients Recovered

LONDON, May 11.—In this city lives a man with a stolen brain. In his head is the brain of an intellectual giant; his own has returned to dust along with the body of the man whose brain was stolen.

That's what the London newspapers say, in telling a story more wonderful than any fiction ever dreamed of.

If it be true, then the greatest surgical triumph of all ages has been wrought. The brain of a genius can have immortal life on earth.

When death impends an operation can remove his brain and in its place put that of an ignorant man, while at the same time the brain of the wise man is transferred to the other's head.

Several years ago Joseph Warschawski—there is a doubt as to the correctness of the name—a youth of humble origin, but of brilliant intellectual attainments, mysteriously disappeared from London.

His father, a furrier, communicated with the police. They were unable to learn anything.

Four years ago Joseph Warschawski was found quite by accident in a wretched East Side tenement in New York. He was then a semi-imbecile, unable to tell what had happened to him. But he could not have arrived in New York in that condition, as he would have been rejected as an undesirable alien.

Recently a famous New York surgeon whose remarkable operations from time to time staggered humanity, died. Among his papers was found one labeled

"The case of Joseph Warschawski."

In the document the surgeon confessed that he had, while in London, heard of the brilliant intellectual attainments of a poor young Polish Jew. He made the acquaintance of the young man, and invited him to some rooms he was occupying near St. Thomas' hospital.

There he administered a potion causing the youth to lose all knowledge of his own identity. He then took passage for himself and his victim by the next boat to New York.

The doctor was a widower with one son, stricken with brain trouble and rapidly approaching imbecility. A few days after the doctor's arrival he performed an

extraordinary operation. The imbecile son and Warschawski were placed under anaesthetics.

Both recovered. The doctor's son rose from his bed a genius and Joseph Warschawski was turned out into the streets of New York a partial imbecile.

The doctor's son, says the report, has become an eminent novelist and dramatist. Two of his plays have been produced with great success, and a London manager has just entered into a contract with him for a third declared to be the master effort of the century.

He declares that there is no truth in the story of his father's astounding operation and threatens immediate action against any person who charges him with having a stolen brain.

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
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
