Tacoma Night Schools Open Tonight; Dream of Hundreds of People Is to Be Realized

The greatest dream of the Scandinavian people of Tacoma will come to a realization tonight when the doors of the public schools will be thrown open for the first session of the free night schools.

Opportunity will be given hundreds of men and women, old and young, who have long yearned for an education, but who have been barred from accomplishing their desire because they were tied down to shop, store, and mill duties and the earning of their daily bread.

Primarily the night schools are intended for the foreigner who has just come to this country and is hampered by knowing nothing of the language, but when they open tonight there will be instructors and classes for every branch and every grade now being taught in the day schools.

Particular attention has been given in the selection of a curriculum to domestic science and the mechanical arts and trades. Classes will be formed in any known subject where 10 or more persons desire the same work.

Sessions will be held three times weekly, on Monday, Wednesday and Friday evenings, and the terms are to be of six months duration.

Classes will open at both the Central and Barlow high schools for instruction in the following subjects: English, mathematics, commercial branches, including bookkeeping, stenography, typewriting and penmanship; mechanical drawing, modern languages, gymnasium work, carpentry and cabinet making, art metal work, electricity, cookery, dressmaking and millinery.

Instruction in elementary branches will be as follows: Franklin school, South 12th street, between Alder and Lawrence; Logan school, South 21st and J streets; Horace Mann school, South 54th and J streets; Roosevelt school, East 38th and V streets; Sheridan school, South 54th and McKinley; Fern Hill school. Instruction in reading, writing, spelling, grammar, arithmetic, history, manual training, mechanical drawing, cooking and sewing.

WEST END IMPROVEMENT CLUB OPPOSED TO BOOSTS

Resolved: That we refuse to concur in the budget as prepared by the city commission providing for increases.—West End Improvement Club.

The foregoing was adopted after the budget had been carefully dissected and the salary boosts reviewed by the West End club last night with but one dissenting voice—that of W. Scott Snyder, city building inspector, who has asked for a salary boost himself from \$100 to \$125 a month.

The club held one of the largest meetings for many months. About 40 taxpayers were present. Nick Klovberg reviewed the various salary boosts proposed in the budget. He thought possibly some offices like the building and boiler inspectors might be paid more but he was against the police and firemen boost.

No one seemed to have a clear idea of just what the city commission does propose as there is nothing in the published budget that indicates what the commission is doing, and who are getting salary raises.

With the progress of the Jefferson avenue extension job the street railway company is getting ready to change its car line to the new street and get away from the steep climb up the hill and an ordinance for a franchise over the new street was introduced this morning.



REACH SETTLEMENT. SEATTLE, Oct. 2.—After a conference between representative business interests in Spokane, Tacoma and Seattle, the various railroads in the state, and the public service commission, which lasted for nearly two days, an agreement is in effect today whereby all questions of shipping rates that have existed between Spokane and coast points have been removed.

The Spokane shippers asked for a decidedly lower carload commodity ratio from the coast to the interior. The agreement finally effected was a compromise rate which becomes operative in 30 days.




