C. R. FONTANA AMONG HIS CHICKENS.

Twelve years ago C. R. Fontana started raising chickens on a shoestring—said shoe string being just a bit of cash, an abundance of nerve and a thorough practical knowledge of chicken raising. Today he's averaging \$1500 a year profit raising chickens on two acres in California. But the story of his success, of hardships he has gone through to attain success isn't the real story. The real story is his warning to inexperienced people to keep out of the poultry business, and his reasons—the reasons of an experienced man who knows. "You wouldn't try to run an auto unless you knew how, would you?" asked Fontana as he scattered a few handfuls of feed into a yard. "Well, chicken raising isn't so very much different from running an auto. You've got to know how. I've been at it off and on for 22 years. And I don't know it all yet. It's a hard game and it isn't so very much different from anything else. By that I mean you've simply got to know what you are doing before you do it. Then there's the money end. No person who expects to make a living and a success of chicken raising ought to start in on less than five acres and from \$1000 to \$2000 in cash. That's a fair start. Less than that is putting a premium on failure. "There's another thing, and that's specializing. You've got to specialize. The man who mixes all kinds of breeds and all ages is going to fail, and for the same reason as the man who tries to raise a few pigs, a couple of cows, a few chickens and a corn crop, fails. I don't mean he'll starve to death; he may make a living, but he won't succeed. Fontana knows. One year he had 500 chickens in his two-acre place and each chicken netted him over and above all expenses just \$3. But Fontana raises chickens scientifically. He can tell you how many chickens in a pen are laying. He has them penned according to age and in each pen
