

GOLD WATCH, REWARD FOR SAVING ELEVEN LIVES

Jack Denise, hero-fireman of the Northern Pacific railroad, who lives in a modest little lodging house at 2409 1/2 Pacific avenue, has just been awarded a handsome gold watch by the company he served at peril of his life on the night of October 12.

It was Jack Denise, a mere boy, who plunged into the jaws of the tunnel, struggled through a black hell of hot smoke and biting, sickening gas to the side of 11 prostrate men and drove them through on the engine of one of the trains to safety. Carrying their seemingly lifeless forms to the engine and driving through to air and life, Jack Denise was saving his company damage suits that would probably amount to hundreds of thousands of dollars.

For risking his life for his company and his comrades, for Denise himself was dragged back from the summit of the Great Divide only through the strenuous efforts of those who waited at the tunnel's mouth, for saving his company a vast amount of money, for preventing untold misery and breaking of hearts in 11 homes, for this Jack Denise has been presented a gold watch, a thing he has always had since he began working for the company, a thing he must have to retain his position.



INVENTOR SCRAPES BOTTOMS OF OCEAN LINERS WHILE IN WATER.



An Australian ship master has made it unnecessary to dock ships for ordinary bottom scraping and cleaning. He has invented a machine that does the work while the vessel is tied up loading cargo and the only expense incurred and the wages of the man cured is that paid for electric power that operates the machine. A submarine electric motor has been coupled to a set of brushes. These are lowered over the side of the ship and the current turned on. When the motor begins to whirl it not only turns the brushes and causes them to crawl along the ship's bottom, but it also operates a small propeller which pushes the machine always against the side of the vessel. All the man in charge is required to do is to keep the machine from climbing over the bulwarks and to shift the machine along to a new path.


