

TO FURTHER PROBE THIEF MYSTERY

LONDON, Dec. 6.—Starting developments in the investigation of the theft of \$50,000 in sovereigns pilfered from a consignment of \$1,000,000 shipped by the Bank of England to the Credit Lyonnais at Alexandria, Egypt, three weeks ago, came to light here today when the disappearance of the original cases was announced.

When the coin arrived at Alexandria it was found that two of the cases had been opened, the gold removed and lead substituted. To ascertain whether or not the robbery was accomplished by imitating the original seals after removing the coin, the British authorities ordered the empty cases shipped back to London for examination.
