

REV. HENDLEY NEW SCHOOL DIRECTOR HAS NO PET HOBBIES BUT HE UNDERSTANDS BOY NATURE

"I think we have pretty good schools right now and there really is nothing I think of that I will try to inaugurate to change present policies," said Rev. H. B. Hendley, today, who was elected school director Saturday. "Of course when I get in and learn the ropes, I may see something I think can be improved, but I have nothing in mind now."

Mr. Hendley apparently is going to fool that consider-

able element of the population which thinks a preacher cannot get into politics without doing something spectacular.

However, his friends say he will be on the job looking for chances to do something of real worth.

Mr. Hendley is pastor of Plymouth Congregational church down in the South End. Some years ago there were a lot of boys there full of spirits who kept things stirred up in the community.

They did not care to hear the preacher, so the preacher concluded he would give them something they did care for. He fitted up the basement of the church with gymnasium apparatus, tables for games and then threw open the doors.

And there were plenty of boys in the basement and fewer broken windows in that neighborhood, which shows that Rev. Hendley understands boy nature.

Tacoma preaching since 1900. Prior to that he lived in Minnesota for 18 years. He was born in Cincinnati.

HOW TO TELL IF YOU HAVE CONSUMPTION

One of the earliest signs of consumption is tire, which is out of all proportion to the apparent cause of it. But, while it is very suggestive of consumption, it is also suggestive of many other diseases, so cannot be taken as conclusive proof by any means.

If a person who thinks he has the disease takes his temperature four times a day or more for a week or so he may find that it varies, being lower in the morning and rising in the afternoon. This is another symptom which is only suggestive and not conclusive.

But both of these symptoms come in the disease before the cough makes its appearance. By the time the cough comes consumption has progressed far enough for a doctor who is a

fairly good diagnostician to find evidences of it in the chest.

There is another suggestive circumstance. That is if the patient remembers having been thrown in close contact with an open case of consumption, in which case was not observed.

But REMEMBER any and all of these symptoms are only SUGGESTIVE of the disease and might equally well point to some other.

However, they are sufficient suggestion that anything existing in the mode of life which could be called unsanitary should be removed; that anything unhygienic be changed, and that a diagnosis be made by a good physician. Helpful treatment of this disease depends very largely on fighting it in its early stages.


