CHARITY COMMISSIONER MAKES ANNUAL REPORT

During the year 1912 Pierce county spent \$9,822.63 in lending aid to needy poor, according to the annual report of Charity Commissioner Watkins. This is the first report of its kind ever issued by the county charity official.

Among those who benefited by this assistance were 362 children, 61 widows, 24 deserted mothers, 18 divorced mothers and 13 infirm persons. For provisions \$6,067.23 was expended; for fuel, \$595; rent, \$946.45; transportation, \$386.55; clothing, \$72.50; shoes, \$82.55; light and water, \$66.40; care of infirm persons, \$284; care of children, \$95.50; expenses and salary, \$1,262.45.
