REAL ESTATE MAN SUED IN COURT

Charges of fraudulent real estate operations have been made against a well known Tacoma firm, the March-McCandless company, by Mrs. Ellie C. Sands, proprietor of the Sands hotel.

The defendant, McCandless, is alleged to have represented to her that Henry Rhodes sought to build a million dollar hotel which would take up a block, on either the Sands hotel block or another piece of property belonging to him.

In her complaint, Mrs. Sands declares she is owner of the Sands hotel, which, with the contiguous property, comprises the entire block.

The plaintiff declares she believed these assertions to be true, that she decided to buy up the rest of the lots in the block, letting McCandless act for her. She says he told her the property would cost about \$14,000 at first, but came to her later, stating that \$15,000 was the best price he could get, and he wanted \$250 as his commission. Furthermore, he is alleged to have asked for \$500 with which to bind the bargain.

This sum she gave him, according to her story.

Then, she declares, she found that the property was never priced for over \$13,000, and that no hotel was to be, or had ever intended to be built there.

Therefore, she says, she asked for her money back, but McCandless denied ever having given him \$500 and has refused to pay. She is suing for the sum in court, with interest from August 24, 1912.


