The annual meeting of the Puget Sound Alumni association of the University of Illinois will be held at the Commercial club rooms tomorrow evening.



ST. PATRICK'S DAY IN DINING ROOM



St. Patrick's day in our house for years has been a fete day. Last year I served a dinner to six little children. While they were waiting for the meal I let them play two little games.

One of them was "The Shamrock Hunt." I hid a lot of paper shamrocks all over the house and sent the children on a hunt for the four leaf ones. The child that found the most of them was given a green bonbon box filled with green candy.

Just before the children sat down at table I carried about a tray with 12 green things upon it—green leaves, green thread, green pickles, green candy, and told them to look them over carefully.

After dinner, when they had forgotten all about it, I gave them pencil and paper and told them to write the names of the things they had seen on the tray.

The dinner table must be kept as a surprise and it can be set in this fashion: For the cover use plain white crepe paper top with an Irish flag crepe flounce. The center piece is a small wheel barrow made of gold card board and filled with green and white paper carnations. Small wheel barrows at each place hold salted pistachio nuts.

Place cards of shamrock made from green paper with tiny clay pipes tied across them. Green paper hats to hold the candy are at each place, the crystal candle holders rest on green lace paper dollies and the white candles are covered with green shades made of tiny Irish flags.

Inside each paper napkin is placed a typical Irish cap, made of green paper. Tiny ribbons, run from the wheel barrow to each place, when pulled, give to each guest a tiny Irish flag. Covered. Here follows a simple St. Patrick's day dinner: Cream of Spinach Soup. Pork Tenderloin cut in round slices. Peas. Potato Balls with Parsley. Parker House Rolls with bits of Citron stuck on the top. Green Grape Salad on Lettuce. Mint Jelly with Whipped Cream. Angel Food broken into irregular pieces and dipped in green Marshmallow Icing. Green and White Mint Wafers. To make the green marshmallow icing mix together 1 cup of granulated sugar and 2 table-spoons cold water. Place over fire and boil until it spins a hair when dropped from a fork. Beat the white of 1 egg to a dry froth. Pull three marshmallows into small pieces and put with the eggs just as the sugar is being turned in very slowly. The hot sugar will melt the marshmallow. Beat until cool and smooth. Color bright green with spinach juice. Dip the torn pieces of angel food into this and set aside to cool.


