### How Long Can a Man Hide From World?

Martin, the Memphis Millionaire, May Be Hiding Just to Win His Wager That a Man Can Drop Out of Sight at Will.

LONDON, April 21.—To win an insignificant wager has Joseph Wilberforce Martin, scion of a wealthy Southern family and himself a millionaire, succeeded in baffling the wits of Europe's greatest detectives.

A few weeks ago Martin and a friend were sitting in the Ritz-Carlton hotel.

"It's peculiar," said the friend, "how people disappear and are never heard of again."

Martin laughed. "Think so—? It's easy!"

The friend became interested. "Probably not as easy as you imagine. Could you drop out of existence?"

Now Martin is a man of affairs in three nations. He has tremendous business connections in America, France and England. Yet he replied: "Yes, I venture to say I can lose myself so completely that you could never find me again until I said 'Kings X' and came out of hiding."

This was a few weeks ago. Now the world is searching for Martin.

Three governments are leaving no stone unturned to find him. Scotland Yard, the French secret service and the Burns agency are searching every city, hamlet and seaport town trying to connect the tangled threads that may lead

to the solution of the mystery. Sedate London is agog over the affair. Martin is a happy-go-lucky chap, with plenty of money and familiar with the art of spending it.

The last seen of him was March 27. He was one of a gay party at the Hotel Cecil.

The fun lasted until morning. Then came the woman of mystery. She was young and beautiful, and rumor said she was a Brazilian.

Men of affairs paid court to her and through them Martin came to know her. He bade his friends good-bye and they left the hotel together.

As Martin drove away he passed out of the lives of his companions as completely as if he had evaporated.

Five days later his torn pocket-book was found near the Thames.

The day following a cabman took Martin's evening hat to Scotland Yard.

His friends instituted a search that has now taken a world-wide scope.

But Martin is still missing. Murder? Blackmail? Suicide?

Or has the young clubman, in a spirit of adventure, seized the opportunity to prove to his friend that it is simple to drop out of sight and remain hidden, despite the efforts of three great governments.

If you know, it is worth \$25,000 to you.

This is the reward that Martin's friends in Memphis, Tenn., and London have offered.
