LONDON, April 26.—Declaring the militant suffragette organization, the Woman's Social and Political union, to be full of spies and traitors, "Gen." Mrs. Flora Drummond Friday summoned a court-martial to try Mrs. Mary Ford of New York on charges of "treason" to the society.

PREDICT BRYAN WILL CHANGE ALIEN BILL

SACRAMENTO, April 26.—While anti-alien legislation is held in abeyance pending the arrival of Bryan Monday, discussion of the probable effect of his visit on the pending legislation is overshadowing other topics at the capitol. Although it is freely predicted that Bryan's visit will be primarily diplomatic and that a move will be made with the intention of assuring Japan that her interests will be looked after by the government, there is a growing conviction among some legislative leaders that Bryan will succeed in materially changing the character of the alien-land bill.

TUBERCULOSIS HOSPITAL IS CERTAIN

The arrangements for the tuberculosis hospital are rapidly shaping up and the new institution will probably be located on the city's 350 acres at Spanaway, at the eastern end of the park. The county commissioners have agreed to establish the hospital, and the city commissioners, at a secret meeting Friday, informally agreed to allow the use of a portion of the city property at Spanaway for the site.

M'GINNITIE IS FREED OF CHARGE

Relying largely on character witnesses to prove his reputation for truth and veracity, T. E. McGinnitie, a deacon in the First Presbyterian church of Seattle, was acquitted in a trial before Judge Clifford and a jury Friday on the charge of grand larceny. McGinnitie is a Seattle real estate man and he had two mortgages due Mrs. C. K. Swofford made out to himself. His explanation to the jury was that Mrs. Swofford owed him money and he took this way of getting it.

STRIKE IS SETTLED

CHARLESTON, W. Va., April 26.—Striking miners of the Kanawha district in convention here agreed to accept the proposal of Governor Hatfield for a settlement of the year-old strike which has been marked with rioting and martial law.

U. S. CRUISER HERE MAY 29

St. Louis, the large U. S. cruiser, will take part in the Memorial day ceremonies here. Mayor Seymour received word yesterday that the boat would arrive May 29 and remain for two days. She will anchor in front of the Stadium.

SCHRANK WANTS TO GIVE GUN TO MUSEUM

MILWAUKEE, April 26.—John Schrank, in Northern insane asylum for shooting Col. Roosevelt, has written to the Milwaukee police asking for the gun with which he shot the ex-president, and also the bullet. He says they belong to him, and he wants to turn them over to the Metropolitan museum at New York. He insists it is a disgrace to send a man of his intellect to the asylum, and he wants to go to prison, in which event he says he would be satisfied at having saved the country from a "third terver."

5 YEARS IN REFORMATORY

GREAT BEND, Kan., April 26.—"I never want to look a pie in the face again, never more," was the remark of Fred Martin, when sentenced in the district court, to serve from five to ten years in the reformatory for stealing three pies.

MILITANTS SPREAD OIL IN COACHES

LONDON, April 26.—Militant suffragettes burned three compartments of the London & South-western railroad train at Luddington station. The carriages were empty. An oil canister was found in one carriage with suffragette literature scattered about. Miss Kenney, a militant, was arraigned in Bow street on a charge of disturbing the peace.
