PRESENTS FOWL AS LAST GIFT; SHOOTSELF

Out of employment and depressed, Bert Davis, age 36, a tinner, living in South Tacoma, yesterday afternoon spent his last cent for a dressed chicken, took it to the home of Mrs. George Addison, 5620 South Durango street, and after presenting the present to Mrs. Addison shot himself through the temple.

Davis was an acquaintance of the Addisons, but had expressed no intention to them of committing suicide. He had made his home at the N. P. hotel, and was formerly employed in the South Tacoma shops.

Davis knocked at the Addison door yesterday with a neat package under his arm. When Mrs. Addison came to the door, the would-be suicide handed her the package, saying that it was a little gift for the family. He talked pleasantly for several minutes, and then walked abruptly into a bedroom. Before Mrs. Addison could follow him, Davis drew a revolver and sent a bullet plunging into his right temple.
