
### MANY KILLED IN BATTLES OF CHIHUAHUA

EL PASO, June 16.—Belated reports from the Mexican interior tell of the killing three weeks ago of 600 feders; soldiers in a battle at Sausillo, in Southern Chihuahua. Bitter fighting has occurred continuously in the southern part of Mexico, and a general order has been issued by Acting Military Governor Mercado calling all federal troops to the protec-
