



Important! Read Carefully

Sixth—SEND IN THE VOTES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS EARLY. Do not wait until the last day only for those that are secured late. The final counting of the votes will take place publicly in the Times office on Tuesday evening, July 29th, at 7:30.
