


DAUGHTER OF FAMOUS DADS BELLES AT EDISON'S BALL

SAN QUENTIN, Cal., Nov. 7.—A great bonfire, composed of about 2,000 striped convicts' suits, will blaze forth on the penitentiary grounds this evening, marking the most notable act of Warden John E. Hoyle. Grouped around it will be the entire number of convict inmates of the prison, dressed in their new uniforms—a grey cadet costume with a black striped hat and arm-bands for honor prisoners.

Local warehouse workmen have asked for a new schedule of wages to increase their present from 30 cents an hour to 40 cents an hour straight time with 60 cents for overtime. This they say is the rate in Portland. A conference with the shippers has been asked to discuss the raise. At the longshoremen headquarters this morning the officers declared there is no possibility of a strike.
