FAMOUS SUFFRAGETTE DECLARES SOCIETY IS HELD RESPONSIBLE

NEW YORK, Dec. 5.—"It is natural that all the women of America should be interested in the effort to save Mrs. Bessie Wakefield from the gallows! Women who bring all human life into the world, know the value of life as men can never know it. One who has borne a child cannot lightly see a life destroyed!" Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, president of the International Woman Suffrage Alliance and by many considered easily the most brilliant of all the great women leaders in the world today, is the speaker.

"Because the women create the race, in agony and tears, they are the CONSERVERS of the race," declared Mrs. Catt in discussing with me the proposed hanging of Bessie Wakefield by the state of Connecticut. "That is why women oppose war—they know THE COST OF FLESH AND BLOOD and the VALUE of HUMAN SOULS shaped from infancy. And that is why women instinctively oppose the legal execution of any human being."

"I would not plead particularly for a woman, I think, even though the woman is the matrix of the race. I am disposed to stand for equality before the law, as I urge equality of men and women in making the law."

"But it is wrong to take the life of any human being for whatever cause. WHO ARE WE to destroy what God has given?" "Justice must be satisfied, they say."

"WHAT IS JUSTICE?" "One judge or jury says it is THIS; another says it is THAT! And in a murder case legal procedure is a gamble, with a human life as the stake!"

"Mrs. Wakefield has been condemned by a judge and jury of men under a strictly literal interpretation of man-made laws. And, as I understand the case, I cannot think that those laws would have been what they are if women had had a hand in their making, or that they would have been interpreted as they have been if women had been in the jury box or on the judge's bench."

"Suppose that Mrs. Wakefield really shared with James Plew the guilt of murdering her husband. Women would have taken into account the forces that made her a murderer—THE HEREDITY AND ENVIRONMENT THAT SHAPED HER WHAT SHE IS."

"And for that heredity and en-

vironment society itself is to blame; society shares her guilt. Society deserves the hangman's rope as much as she.

"If society had taken an interest in Bessie Wakefield previously to its decision to hang her, there would have been no murder."

"But there is said to be a serious doubt of the woman's guilt. And certainly so long as there is the slightest doubt the irreparable step of execution should not be taken."

"Let us keep Bessie Wakefield in prison, if need be; but let us not hang her, with all the brutalizing effect on human nature—and then discover, to our sorrow, that she was innocent, after all."

"And let society, which gave HER no chance, see that her children do not grow up with a still worse handicap than hers."
