



### Can't Raise Bonds, Diggs and Gilligan Must Stay in a Cell

When she took the stand she was calm and manifested no symptoms of nervousness. She told without a blush the sordid tale of how Maury Diggs, Walter Gilligan and Paul Spott assaulted her in a hotel room after dragging her on New Year's eve.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 10.—Maury I. Diggs and Walter J. Gilligan, accused by Ida Pearing, were held to answer to the superior court by Judge Wiley F. Crist, and their bonds fixed at \$10,000 or \$5,000 cash.

This action on the part of the police magistrate was taken despite the plea of Attorney Nathan Coghlan that the case be dismissed through insufficient evidence. The first witness was Mrs. Elizabeth Pearing, mother of the complainant. She was questioned particularly regarding the names, ages and birthplaces of her children. In reply to a question she said that she could not remember the present whereabouts of the doctor or the nurse who attended her upon the birth of her daughter Ida, which she said occurred in San Jose.

Many employees of the Holland hotel were witnesses. According to these witnesses Diggs, Gilligan and the Pearing girl came into the Hotel Holland on New Year's eve and sat for some time in the lounge, or "pluk" room, on the main floor. It appears that Gilligan, who was a regular guest at the hotel, and occupied room 64, engaged a room for room 102 on that night, saying that he wished to give his room to a friend and intended to occupy 102 himself. The purpose of the defense evidently was to show by this testimony that Diggs and Gilligan had occupied room 102 and that Miss Pearing had slept in room 64. Diggs and Gilligan were remanded into custody and lodged in jail pending the trial or release on bail. It is said bail will be arranged for both men tomorrow.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 10.—President Wilson Monday informed senators in charge of the immigration bill that he is opposed to the literary test. Senator Lodge and others who are pushing immigration restriction are firm for the literary test. The immigration bill promises to be one of the snags of the present session, as both sides are full of firm convictions.

### Honor Tilden Today

ALBANY, N. Y., Feb. 10.—Special ceremonies were held at the capitol today in honor of the one hundredth anniversary of the birth of Samuel J. Tilden. Similar exercises are being held simultaneously in all states of the Union. Ralph Pulitzer, Herman Rider and Robert E. Henschel were officers of the committee which planned the country-wide ceremonies. President Wilson has been asked to deliver an address memorializing Tilden, at Carnegie hall, New York, tomorrow night.
