

FIFTEEN UNITS FOR GRADUATION

Fifteen units or "credits" will be sufficient for high school graduation instead of 16, in the future, according to a decision of the state board of education, made yesterday at the session being held in Tacoma. This is done in order to help the backward pupil, who is liable to fall in one of his studies during the four terms, and as a benefit to the forward ones, who will be able to graduate in three years by taking five studies each year.
