WHAT'S DOING IN POLITICS

With four majority candidates present and Judge Winsor, president of the Seattle school board and defeated candidate for mayor of Seattle on the socialist ticket, as the principal speaker, Homer T. Bone, socialist aspirant for the office of mayor at the spring elections, formally opened his campaign last night in Moose hall before an audience of several hundred persons.

Rev. W. A. Moore acted as chairman of the meeting. M. W. Greer was the first speaker to take the stand. Greer declared he would attend the duties of the office of mayor with the same care that he would exercise in managing his own affairs.

W. L. Kirby said he believed he was qualified for the mayor's position by virtue of his mechanical knowledge. He declared he could save the city money.

H. P. Burdick said the business of handling a city's affairs was an intricate one, and required trained knowledge. Mr. Burdick thought he was fitted for the position.

E. O. Healey favors municipal ownership if it pays, municipal garbage collection, a port district and a "close to town" public library.

Judge Winsor scorned the speakers for wanting to run the city government for profit. Public utilities should be run for the people, he said. He opposed any platform that would have as its chief aim the saving of the Al mighty dollar. "Our cities would be more prosperous, our people would be better if they followed the teachings of the humble Nazarene," he said.

At the close of his speech Dr. Moore said he wished every preacher in Tacoma had heard his speech.

Homer Bone in a short address declared for a municipal cold storage plant, the refusal to renew the telephone company's franchise, the extension of municipal activities in all lines. "The only way to control corporations is to own," said Bone.

L. G. Parks of the Citizens' league, recently organized to consider local politics, has issued a statement of the principles of the organization which declares the club is formed to study government, cultivate a spirit of co-operation and work for the public good.

Apparently there is going to be war in the ranks of the socialist "Reds" themselves Monday afternoon James Button and L. Percival filed their nomination for councilman as did Adam Barth for mayor. This fills the list of candidates. But Leslie Allen, another "Red," wants to get in the game. He appeared with his nominating petitions Monday afternoon, but they were irregular, so he has to take them back and get them corrected. He was running for "commissioner" instead of "councilman." When he gets them corrected there will probably be war between Allen and the other Reds.
