P. C. KAUFFMAN, VETERAN BANKER, CALLED BY DEATH

P. C. Kauffman, secretary of the Washington State Bankers' association, former vice president of the Fidelity Trust company, and one of the best known and most able bankers in the Northwest, died last evening at his home, 402 North J street, following an illness of more than a year. He leaves his widow, Mrs. Katherine Barton Kauffman, two sons, Percival Barton and Walter Lee Kauffman, and one brother and sister in Ohio. Mr. Kauffman was 56 years old.

Mr. Kauffman had been forced to resign from the Fidelity bank a year ago because of illness. He was affected with heart trouble. During his active business career he was treasurer of the American Bankers' association, a member of the charter commission that wrote Tacoma's commission charter, a member of the board of the Tacoma General hospital and the Ferry Museum, a member of the Theta Delta Chi fraternity, the Commercial Union and Country clubs of Tacoma, and was a vestryman of Trinity Episcopal church. The remains are at the Hoska-Buckley-King company's.

TWO CAUGHT IN A PLOT AGAINST GIRL

SAN FRANCISCO, April 9.—Pretty 17-year-old Helen Hume, daughter of the late Joseph Hume, once a millionaire salmon packer, and Mrs. Bessie Hume, is under the care of her mother and a physician today as the result of the nervous strain consequent on her swearing to the complaint that has resulted in the arrest of Samuel Leibman, a tailor, 31 years old, living at the Winton hotel, and Charles Anderson, 23 years old, a taxicab driver.

The men are charged with an offense similar to that with which Maury I. Diggs and Walter Gilligan are charged by Miss Ida Peering.

According to J. W. Cowart, a private detective, who collected the evidence, Anderson has confessed. Leibman denies the charge.

Miss Hume on her 18th birthday will inherit \$30,000 left her by her father, Joseph Hume, one of the founders of a big Alaska Packing company. In addition, she has an income of \$100 a month.

Leibman and Anderson are in the city prison, being unable to raise the \$10,000 bail required for each. Their cases are set for hearing April 12.

The arrest was made by Detective Barron, acting under orders of Detective Redmond, head of the "white slave" squad.

After he got the game working properly Ellis would probably have raised the price, but the grand jury concluded to spoil the enterprise. He will be tried April 17.


