

# SENATE TAKES HARD SLAP AT JOHN D.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 6.—The senate was emphatic in its vote yesterday that none of the funds provided for farm demonstration and cotton boll weevil work should be used in connection with contributions coming from the General Education board, which has been endowed with \$42,000,000 by John D. Rockefeller and who has given \$250,000 annually for payment of salaries. Senator Anhurst in speaking against the contributions declared he was not in favor of any rich man like the Rockefellers or the Carnegies patronizing the government with money procured through the intimidation of employees.

# Council O.K.s Appointments of the Mayor

Appointment of Dr. Kathleen Anderson as bacteriologist and chemist for the city, and Mrs. James A. Hays as trustee on the public library board, was confirmed by the council today. They were the first appointments made by Mayor Fawcett, and the only ones placed before the council by him today. Mrs. Hays takes the place of Mrs. O. G. Ellis, who has been a library trustee for seven years, and who resigned yesterday because she is leaving for the east. Dr. Anderson will be bacteriologist and chemist for the health department. G. L. Pitchford will continue to do chemical work for Commissioner Woods, at a salary of \$75 per month.
