TOO MUCH PEP IN McHENRY'S DELIVERY FOR BENGAL MEN

MINORS WILL REVOLT IF FOURTH MAJOR BASEBALL LEAGUE IS FORMED

Politics; politics—the magnates seem determined to hold the stage this summer, and strive by Murphysque tactics to get some more publicity than their clubs are receiving.

The last outburst is a proposal seriously made after a conference of National, American, International league and American Association officials, to create a new major league.

The "organized baseball" trust has scored rather heavily against the new league in the courts; not because any court holds its monopoly as sacred, but because the courts believe the Federals acted illegally.

The courts have repeatedly held that the establishing of businesses by a "trust" so as to crush out opposition is not only illegal, but criminally so.

The country having shown that it will not support three major leagues it seems idiotic to create a fourth.

But aside from this look at the effect of such a move on organized baseball itself. It means the destruction of two Class A leagues; and the dropping of four clubs in each.

If the new major league is made of these two big minors, what of the Pacific Coast league's claim to equality? Is it to be supposed the Pacific Coast league will submit to draft by its equals?

What of the eight clubs that are to be dropped? They are worth for franchises and players at least half a million dollars.

Is it to be supposed that Charlie Somers, the man whose money saved and then made the American league, will submit to having

his Cleveland Association team dropped back, and given to the Central, or to the South Michigan or Ohio State league? On the other hand, will he permit the Association team to be made

a major team and placed on an equality with his American league team?

Do they suppose for an instant that the Cantillons will submit to being dropped from the Association without a fight? Nay, nay. Nor will Norris O'Neill lose

a chance. If Milwaukee, Kansas City and Minneapolis are dropped he will claim them for the Western league.

Then the Western would have to drop three or four clubs, and a scramble would ensue that would reach clear down the line.
