BLOODSHED IN HOME RULE STRUGGLE

DUBLIN, July 27.—Three men and one woman were killed and more than 60 persons wounded in a clash between a battalion of the King's Own Scottish Borderers and a mob consisting chiefly of nationalist volunteers on the streets of Dublin yesterday afternoon.

The battle was the result of an attempt of the borderers to seize a quantity of arms that were landed Saturday night at Howth, nine miles from Dublin, from a private yacht.

A battalion of the King's Own Scottish Borderers was ordered to capture the arms when the authorities heard the volunteers were bringing them into the city.

The soldiers encountered a detachment of volunteers at Clonmelle bridge and an outbreak resulted, but there was no shooting.

Soon a great crowd collected and followed the troops, jeering them and cheering for John Redmond, the nationalist leader, and home rule. Finally the mob began throwing bottles and stones, injuring several soldiers.

To this attack the battalion replied with a scattered fusillade. In an instant the street was crowded with wounded, while terrified men, women and children ran in all directions.

ENTERS OREGON WILDS CLAD IN NATURES GARB



Joe Knowles, "man-animal" clad in skin of bear he killed in Maine woods during his experiment there last year. He went into the wilds of Siskiyou mountains a few days ago absolutely naked and says he will emerge 30 days from now fully clad in clothes of his own manufacture from skins of furs.

GRANT'S PASS, Ore., July 27.—Joe Knowles, "man-animal," has gone naked into the wilds of the Siskiyou mountains, without arms, foods, matches—with only his bare hands and his wits and knowledge of woodcraft to keep him from starvation or death from wild animals. Thirty days from now, he says he will emerge fully clad in clothes he made from skins of animals trapped or from the fibre of plants and trees.

In the beginning he will live on nuts, berries and roots—will build a hut and try to snare a few wild animals. He will sleep on a bed of moss and his only covering will be the heavens. He will build a fire by rubbing dried sticks together and using dried bark as tinder to fan the sparks into a flame. He will catch fish by turning a stream into a hollow of his own making and when fish have followed into it he will turn the stream back again into its course.
