# HEAVY CANNON RUSHED TO FRONT IN DANGER ZONE

PARIS, Nov. 24.—The Germans are attacking the allies' line vigorously in the Argonne region and along the Aisne, while the Kaiser is rushing heavy reinforcements to his troops along the Belgian coast. The expectation is today that another desperate attempt will be made by

the Germans to break through the allies' lines to Dunkirk and Calais. The Germans are reported to be bringing their heaviest Krupp cannon to the front. The whole country is covered with a thin coating of ice. The Germans have abandoned many transport wagons, which are mired and frozen in.

## JAPAN HAS BIG ARMY WAITING

LONDON, Nov. 24.—Arthur Dioso, founder of the Japan society and an authority on Anglo-Japanese affairs, says:

"If it is necessary to increase the allied forces in Europe, the Japanese are willing and ready to supply immediately a large, admirably equipped and highly

trained army. The trans-Siberian railway and an ample supply of Japanese steamships make easy the transportation of 500,000 men in two months."

## For Great White Way

Tacoma's Great White Way lighting system will be extended. By unanimous vote of the city council, D street and Jefferson avenue were included in a new lighting district, to be equipped with the same style of luminous arcs that are now in existence on Pacific and C streets. The lights will be placed on C from 17th to Jefferson; D from 7th to 21st, and Jefferson from Pacific to 21st. The cost will be \$17,241, to be paid by the property owners. Electric Superintendent Collins was ordered to begin work at once, and give the work to the poor. The iron poles will be constructed in Tacoma.
