BLIND TO DEATH

EVERETT, Feb. 12.—That Robert Pershaw died from loss of blood, rather than a fracture of the skull, was the decision of the coroner's jury at Snohomish. It found that Hiram D. Lance, who came here from Bear Creek, Ida., last week to recover the custody of his 6-year-old son, fired the shot that struck Pershaw in the leg. The father told the authorities of his troubles Tuesday and was advised by Probation Officer Randall to go and get his son. When he went Pershaw resisted and the fatal fight ensued.
