REPLY TO CHARGES OF BANK
WASHINGTON, D. C., April 13.—Secretary of the Treasury McAdoo and Comptroller of Currency Williams today gave out answers to the charge that they had attempted to wreck the Riggs National bank of Washington, D. C.
The bank charged it had withdrawn large deposits at critical times, without just reason; had demanded many reports, and penalties of \$100 a day for not answering; and in general had persecuted it by virtue of the power of their offices, out of personal spite.
Williams' answer was that the affairs of the bank were in a serious condition, due to stock speculation it carried on under dummies and to loans made to officers, also through dummies.
TWO FIRES BREAK OUT IN ELLENSBURG, April 13.—Two fires—one in the attic and one in the basement—discovered at the same time in the normal school building, led school authorities to suspect incendiarism. Loss is not over \$2,500, as a volunteer company from school did effective work, as well as did the town department.

Disbar Smalley
F. A. Smalley, pioneer attorney of Tacoma, today was permanently disbarred from practice by Superior Judge Chapman.
Smalley was convicted of misappropriating \$1,500 from an estate of which he was administrator, and was sentenced to a term in Walla Walla. He was later pardoned by Gov. Lister.
On the basis of this pardon,

he fought disbarment, claiming it had wiped away his offense altogether.
Judge Chapman, however, ruled that the moral turpitude involved alone was sufficient to warrant disbarment.
