## WHOLE BOATLOAD GOING OVER TO BERRY FESTIVAL

More than 500 Tacomas are expected to leave the Municipal dock on a special steamer for Burton tomorrow morning to attend the Western Washington Federation of Improvement clubs, and the Vashon Island strawberry festival, to be held jointly at the Island city.

A large delegation from Seattle will attend on another special steamer, and the delegates from both cities will engage in an athletic program for supremacy of the Sound.

Outside of electing officers for the ensuing year and outlining an active plan of work, the federation will probably do no work, according to L. G. Parks, secretary of the organization. Each of the 27 clubs of Tacoma will send delegates. The public is invited.

## PRISONER TRIES TO HANG SELF IN CELL

Determined to end his life, George Koenig, age 5, owner of a large ranch near Sumner, attempted to hang himself this morning from the bars of his cell at the city jail, where he was held for safe-keeping, by making a rope of his suspenders and shirt, and fastening it to his throat. Other prisoners saw Koenig just after he had drawn the improvised hangman's noose tight, and called Jailer Rivard, who cut away the rope.

E. R. Wheeler, wealthy manufacturer, has a great idea. He told it to Justice Graham the last time he was arrested for speeding. Wheeler's idea is that the sped coppers should wear uniforms so that a fellow could tell when he was going to be stopped and fined. This present idea of having the cops hide behind some bush, and then spring out and catch a man—and also the plainclothes idea—says Wheeler, is dangerous, arbitrary, anarchistic, and decidedly middleclass.

The fact that his suggested rule was not in force cost Mr. Wheeler \$10.
