

# Europe Sure to Accept Polygamy After War, Says

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 3.—Polygamy as a means of repopulating Europe after the war today was seriously advanced by Miss Emma Lucy Gates, granddaughter of Brigham Young, pioneer Mormon leader.

Coming from Europe since the outbreak of hostilities, Miss Gates predicts that the women of the war-drained nations are today ready to accept polygamous marriage.

"Many girls in the old world have told me," she said, "that they would much prefer being a plural mate of a man who could give them a pleasant home, where they could live a useful life, to being an old maid."

"I was for 12 years in Berlin, and I have heard numbers of German women say they thought it far better to have a home and family on a polygamous basis, where a husband took proper care of his children, than the system of monogamy which in Europe tacitly permits several affinities."

"And as a result of this war I firmly believe these ideas regarding marriage are going to be generally practiced."

Miss Gates said she did not espouse free love.

Asked about her views on eugenics, Miss Gates replied: "I do not hold eugenics necessary where men live like our Mormon boys. Our Mormon standard of purity is the same for men as for women."

"A good deal of misapprehension exists regarding polygamy. For instance, Mormon women always had an equal vote with the men in the church, so, if they lived in polygamy it was because they permitted it."

"My grandfather, who had 57 children, never made any discrimination in giving them presents. "I am intimately acquainted today with the four wives of President Smith of the Mormon church and each has the same things the others have."

## FUNERAL PARTY COLLIDES WITH BOY ON BICYCLE


Four pall-bearers and a minister, returning from a funeral at South Tacoma, were piled up in nondescript fashion late yesterday afternoon, when the automobile in which they were riding turned on its side after colliding with a young bicyclist. The five men were caught under the canopy of the touring car's top, and had to be hauled out by bystanders.

All of them, except Rev. Herman J. Wegner, 1309 South 1st st., pastor of the Trinity Evangelical German Lutheran church, whose hand was mashed, escaped without injury.

Joseph Moise, age 20, son of Raymond Moise, proprietor of the French-Italian grocery, 5202 Union avenue, was severely injured in the collision. The boy was delivering groceries and turned into the South Tacoma boulevard at 45th street just in time to be struck by the auto.

His chest was crushed and his injuries are said to be of a serious nature.

The pall-bearers' auto was driven by C. C. Mellinger, Tacoma undertaker. The occupants were Rev. Wegner, J. P. Feuerstine, Carl Wille, N. P. Jensen and H. Pochert.


## K. OF C. OPENS ITS CONVENTION



## BUY-IN-TACOMA CAMPAIGN SAVES FACTORY TO CITY

The "Buy in Tacoma" spirit manifested itself during July in manufacturing circles. As a consequence the Eagle Macaroni Co. turned down free sites in Spokane and Billings, Mont., and erected a modern plant, costing \$40,000, at 26th and A sts., and the Flex Co. moved to larger quarters.

The Eagle Co.'s old plant on lower Pacific ave. burned on March 17, destroying the entire factory. The company, under the direction of Joseph Nagagnini, refused outside sites and immediately added an extra floor to the

brick Swift building, ordering new machinery.

The new plant has a maximum output of 12,000 pounds of macaroni a day and employs 26 men. Three floors and a basement, 50 by 120 feet, are taken up by the manufacturing, packing, shipping and office departments of the plant.

The Flex Co., manufacturers of ventilating and induced draft systems, has announced its intentions of moving its plant on the tidelands to the plant at 2311 East D st., formerly used by the Carbon Chemical Co.
