PLATTSBURG, N. Y., Aug. 26.—A policy of aggressive aid to the allies against Germany was advocated forcefully last night by Col. Theodore Roosevelt, ex-president. He termed Germany as a country brutal and ruthless in its foreign affairs, guilty of the grossest international immorality.

BERLIN, Aug. 26.—With public opinion very generally for peace with the United States, there was every indication in officialdom today that unless the submarine which sank the Ansaldo had some particularly good reason for so doing, its action will be disavowed.

Expect Fall Of Bielostok

BERLIN, Aug. 26.—The capture of Bielostok, midway between Warsaw and Vilna, on the railway to Petrograd, is believed to be a matter of hours. Having hacked his way toward the railroad through the Russian rear guard, von Gallwitz was within eight miles of Bielostok early yesterday.
