SWAPS HOSPITALS ARE WARNED OF NEW CITY ORDINANCE

Police Captain Read today requested newspapers to publish a notice that physicians and hospitals which, hereafter, do not report accidents immediately to headquarters will be punished for a misdemeanor under a city ordinance. An ordinance requiring such reports has been in effect two weeks now, but no prosecutions have been made, pending the time when all affected would become familiar with it. However, a case in which such a report was not made, yesterday, resulted in today's warning by Capt. Read. It was an auto accident which happened on Friday, but was not reported until yesterday.
