Swiss Army Belongs to the People and Nobody Belongs to the Army

SECRET OF TINY REPUBLIC'S DEFENSES

The secret of the success of Switzerland in creating and maintaining a citizen soldiery without hardships on anyone and without any of the dangers of militarism, and at the same time having the most efficient military defense of any country in the world lies in one fact:

THE ARMY BELONGS TO THE PEOPLE AND NOBODY BELONGS TO THE ARMY.

The army is made to aid and not interfere with the ordinary duties of citizens. And the Swiss do not permit a group of militarists to order around the rest of the citizens.

The Swiss have imposed their military system upon themselves, because Switzerland is a republic in fact as well as name. The military education of the people begins in the public school and is a part of the general educational system. In Switzerland universal education up to the age of 15 years is compulsory, and all during this period simple gymnastic exercises are required of all pupils as a preparation for military service.

There are also volunteer cadet corps of boys from 11 to 16 years, in which drills and some exercises in the manual of arms are given. Target practice is the real purpose of these corps, for rifle shooting is the national sport in Switzerland.

A boy would as soon refrain from target shooting in Switzerland, as a boy in the United States would abstain from playing ball. The canton gives a money prize of 5 francs (\$1) to each member whose shooting is reported upon favorably by the instructor. After 16 years of age and up to 20 the Swiss boy may, if he chooses, become a member of a preparatory military organization, operating on the same lines as a cadet corps, except that the regular army musket is furnished.

These corps do none of the tiresome and useless stunts required of the usual "militar" training. They don't have drill halls, or practice intricate movements, with "head up, chest out, feet at an angle of 45 degrees," and all the usual precision of tiresome "drills." Instead the emphasis is laid upon gymnastic and shooting.

To be a member of this corps means pleasant walks, climbs, marches and afternoons devoted to games of shooting. At the age of 20 comes the call to military duty.

This does not mean separation from family, life in "barracks," three or four years of grinding and uninteresting military drill. To get into the Swiss army means a high degree of merit; to be refused is a sign of unfitness—and no Swiss boy wants to be declared unfit to defend his country.

The young men are put through a stiff medical examination, then a literary examination, then elementary gymnastic tests, then a running test of 80 yards, which must be made in under 14 seconds.

Those falling below a certain standard are exempted. If totally disqualified they are allowed not more than four years to qualify if they can; if only partially disqualified, they are incorporated in the auxiliary force; that is, the pioneers, hospital, commissary, intelligence and transport departments.

If totally disqualified, the man must pay a military tax. The examination over, the recruit goes home. Next spring he is called out for his first training, given a uniform and rifle (which he takes home and keeps until the end of his military service at the age of 50 when they become his property).

The recruits during their first year serve for different periods,

according to the arm of the service; infantry and engineers, 65 days; artillery and garrison troops, 75 days; cavalry, 90 days; auxiliary troops, 60 days.

Roughly, the recruit is taken away from his regular employment for only about two months (at the most three).

After that the men in the Elite (or first line) are called out only seven times during their term of service (up to age 32) and then

only for a period of eleven days on each call. The Landwehr (ages 33 to 40) is called out only once for a training period of 11 days. The Landsturm is not called out except in case of war or national danger.

How Switzerland can with such a minimum of training, have such an efficient army, and how Uncle Sam could imitate her example, will be described in the next article.

Where Is Cut In Police Budget?

Although Mayor Fawcett and other public officials have insisted on a decrease of expense in the police department for 1916, and Commissioner Mills has made a grandstand announcement of slashing cuts in this department, scrutiny of his budget expense today failed to show where any radical cuts had been made.

Instead of the discharge of 15 patrolmen, as had been announced, the budget allows for a decrease in total salaries of the department amounting to \$5,850 over this year. This would mean that only five officers will be discharged.


