### Stampfler Good Guide

## On Mountain But City Streets Bewilder Him

Jules Stampfler, official guide on Mount Tacoma, who has probably guided more tourists about the rugged peak than any other person, met his Waterloo today when he attempted to navigate the busy streets of Tacoma.

Stampfler may be able to climb precipices, and jump glacial crevasses, but when it comes to juggling city curbs, and keeping out of the way of traffic, he is out of his element.

The guide crossed Pacific av. this morning in a hurry. He started to step up on the curb in front of the Pantages theater. His foot caught in the curb, and he performed a perfect head-first-most dive to the pavement.

Policeman Nelson picked Stampfler up and helped him into an ambulance. He had sustained a cut five inches long over his left eye, and the wound bled profusely. At the Tacoma General hospital it was necessary to take 10 stitches.
